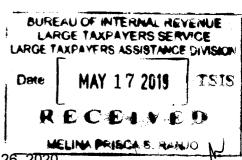

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

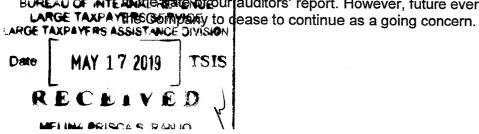
Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

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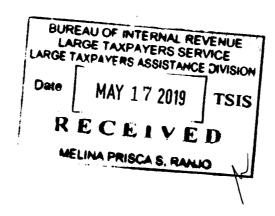

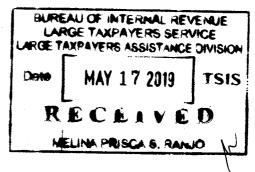

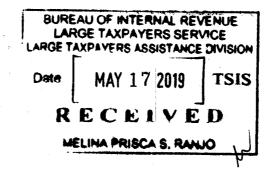
